Our local Catholic schools impact the lives of more than 16,000 young people and their families each year. The education offered in these schools is unmatched, with test scores consistently above state and national averages and a 99% graduation rate. More than 94% of Catholic school students in the Diocese of Orange go on to pursue a four-year college degree, with more than \$100 million in total scholarships awarded to our high school graduates last year alone.

While these statistics are impressive, they do not tell the whole story. In addition to academic excellence, the 31 elementary schools and 5 high schools in the diocese
